



Opportunity to serve as the NWT member of the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada

The Government of Canada is looking for candidates interested in serving as the NWT representative on the Historic Sites and Monuments Board of Canada (HSMBC).

Since 1919, the HSMBC has provided advice to the Government of Canada on the designation of places, persons and events that are of national historical significance.

The NWT's Board member must reside in the Territory. Candidates should:

- Be prepared to participate in at least two meetings a year, where the HSMBC reviews new national historic persons, places and events suggested by public nomination;
- Have knowledge of cultural practices that shape the NWT through experience or education related to the conservation or commemoration of cultural heritage (e.g. being a knowledge keeper within your community); and
- Be prepared to take on this role for a renewable term (typically two to five years in length) for which you will receive an honorarium based on days worked.

Members of one or more of the following groups are encouraged to apply: Indigenous peoples, women, persons with disabilities, and members of visible minorities.

Candidates interested in this opportunity should submit a cover letter and their resume by September 18, 2020.
